DATGANIAD I’R WASG:

CYNNYDD SYLWEDDOL MEWN YMWELWYR I GŴYL FACH Y FRO 2016

Yn dilyn llwyddiant Gŵyl Fach y Fro llynedd, mae Menter Bro Morgannwg yn falch iawn i gyhoeddi y gwelwyd cynnydd sylweddol yn nifer yr ymwelwyr i'r wyl yn ei ail blwyddyn.

Daeth dros 3,000 o ymwelwyr i fwynhau'r wyl rhad ac am ddim yma ar Ynys y Barri ddydd Sadwrn – cynnydd o bron i 80% i'w gymharu â llynedd (1,700).

Gyda chefnogaeth Llywodraeth Cymru, Cyngor Celfyddydau Cymru a Chyngor Bro Morgannwg, roedd modd ehangu llawer ar arlwyr diwrnod – am y tro cyntaf eleni roedd stondinau crefft a chynnrych Cymraeg, bar, stondinau bwyd, adloniant stryd, ac amryw o weithdai crefft, sircas a chwaraeon – ac fe roedd yr ymateb i'r datblygiadau newydd yma'n wych.

Roedd y line-up yn cynnwys rhai o artistiaid mwyaf blaengar y sín gerddoriaeth Gymraeg – gan gynnwys Meic Stevens, Sorela a Sŵnami – ac roedd nifer o'r artistiaid yma'n dod i berfformio ar Ynys y Barri am y tro cyntaf erioed. Roedd hefyd yn gyfle arbennig i roi llwyfan i artistiaid lleol – Hanna Morgan a Lost in Chemistry (enillwyr Brwydr y Bandiau Maes B/C2 2015).

Wrth siarad am llwyddiant yr wyl eleni, dywedodd Siân Lewis, Prif Weithredwr Menter Bro Morgannwg:

Ry'n ni wrth ein boddyd gyda llwyddiant Gŵyl Fach y Fro eleni. Mae'r niferoedd ddaeth i fwynhau yr Wyl yn brawf ein bod wedi llwyddo i greu gŵyl sydd ag apêl eang i Gymry Cymraeg a di-Gymraeg y Barri – a thu hwnt. Ein targed eleni oedd denu 2,500 o bobl ac ry'n ni wedi cyrraedd tu hwnt i'r targed hynny gyda dros 3,000 yn mynychu. Roedd mwy o weithgareddau a mwy o bartneriaid na llynedd. Mae Gŵyl Fach y Fro wedi tyfu oherwydd ymateb i'r galw cynyddol yn y Fro am gyfleoedd i gymdeithasu a mwynhau'r iaith Gymraeg.

A BIG INCREASE IN VISITORS TO GWYL FACH Y FRO 2016

Following last year's successful establishment of Gŵyl Fach y Fro, Menter Bro Morgannwg are very pleased to announce that the festival has grown substantially and attracted many more visitors to this year's event.

Over 3,000 people attended this free and inclusive festival which was held on Barry Island on Saturday – an increase of nearly 80% compared to last year (1,700).

With support from Welsh Government, Wales Arts Council and the Vale of Glamorgan Council, the organisers were able to introduce lots of new elements to the event – for the first time this year there were stalls selling local Welsh crafts and produce, bar, food stalls, street entertainers, and a variety of arts and crafts, circus and sports workshops – and the response shows that these new developments have been very well received.

The line-up included some of the biggest names in the Welsh music scene – including Meic Stevens, Sorela and Sŵnami – and many of these artists were performing on Barry Island for the first time. It was also great to invite local artists to perform through the medium of Welsh – Hanna Morgan and Lost in Chemistry (winners of the National Eisteddfod/Maes B/C2 Battle of the Bands 2015).

Speaking about the festival's success, Siân Lewis, Menter Bro Morgannwg Chief Executive, said: *We are overjoyed with the success of this year's Gŵyl Fach y Fro. The number of people who came to enjoy the festival is proof that we have succeeded to create a festival which attracts a vast audience of Welsh and non-Welsh speakers – from Barry and beyond. Our target was to attract 2,500 people to Gŵyl Fach y Fro 2016, and we have exceeded this target with over 3,000 people attending this year's event. There were many more activities and partners involved in this year's festival. Gŵyl Fach y Fro has grown as a response to the growing demand by the Vale's citizens for more opportunities to socialise and enjoy through the medium of Welsh.*
