

# What is Dydd Miwsig Cymru?

Dydd Miwsig Cymru – Welsh Language Music Day – takes place on Friday 13 February 2026, and it's a celebration of the vibrant world of Welsh language music. From timeless folk traditions to cutting-edge electronica, from indie anthems to hip hop beats, Welsh music reflects a living language and a thriving creative culture.

Lots of organisations have supported the day in the past including Dŵr Cymru, Mentrâu Iaith, Amgueddfa Cymru, National Library of Wales, FAW and the Urdd. They have shown support by hosting gigs, pledging to add Welsh language miwsig to their playlists on an ongoing basis, playing only Welsh language music on the day and sharing Welsh language music playlists to their thousands of followers on social media - it's really easy to get involved, and we can help.

Whether your organisation will be celebrating from your workplace or digitally, there's still lots of ways you can get involved.



# How can you take part?

- **Turn up the volume:** Play Welsh language music in your workplace or during virtual meetings. Use our ready-made playlists or ask us to create one just for you.
- **Bring the buzz:** Host a live gig or an online performance with a Welsh language artist.
- **Show your support visually:** Update your social media profile picture or banner with Dydd Miwsig Cymru branding.
- **Join the conversation:** Share your love for Welsh music on social media. Follow @Cymraeg and use #Miwsig and #DyddMiwsigCymru – we'll amplify your posts!
